

CONTESTANT INFORMATION

Ground Rules:

Barrel racing is approved for first slack event.

Back numbers must be worn.

Only actual contestant and one companion allowed gate access.

Bareback and saddle bronc events may be combined or may have two sections, depending on number of entries.

Two-head competition in all events shall be back to back, same performance.

2010 Year-End Championship Ground Rules Adopted May 1, 2010

1. Year-End *Event* Championships at the Steamboat Springs Pro Rodeo Series are determined by Championship Points. One Championship Point is awarded for each dollar won in a PRCA/WPRA event during the months of June and July. In order to encourage late season entries, **two** points are awarded for each dollar won in a PRCA/WPRA event during the month of August.
2. To be eligible for a Year-End *Event* Championship, a contestant must enter and compete in that event three or more times. [To be eligible for the Pat Mantle Memorial Bronc Riding, a contestant must be among the Top Six bronc riders (that have entered and competed in the Saddle Bronc Riding at more than one rodeo) in Championship Points after the final Regular Season rodeo. In the event any of the Top Six do not compete, the opportunity goes to the next highest ranked contestant.]
3. Ground Money does not count.
4. In two go-round competitions, both Go-Round and Average monies will be counted.
5. Bull Riding Day Money does not count toward the Bull Riding Year-End Event Championship, nor toward the Year-End All-Around Championship.
6. The Year-End *All-Around* Champion is the contestant who **earns the most Championship Points in two or more PRCA events**. To qualify for the All-Around Championship, contestants must fulfill the Minimum Competition Requirement (MCR) by competing in **at least two different PRCA events at least three times each**. It is not necessary for contestant to earn points in both qualifying events provided points are earned in at least two events. As long as MCR is fulfilled, points from all PRCA events counts toward the All-Around Championship. If none of the contestants who have fulfilled the MCR earn points in two or more events, the All-Around Champion will be the contestant who has fulfilled the MCR and earns the most points in one event. In the event no one fulfills the MCR, the All-Around Champion will be the contestant who earns the most points in two or more events regardless of times competed. If the All-Around still remains unclaimed, the All-Around will be the contestant who earns the most points in one event.
7. Championship Points earned in the #11 Roping do not count toward the Year-End *All-Around* Championship. For the #11 Roping Season Championship, one Championship Point is awarded for every dollar won during the months of June and July **with the exception of July 3-4, 2010**. During this time period, one #11 Roping Championship Point is awarded for **every two dollars** won. In order to encourage late season entries, **two** points are awarded for each dollar won in the #11 Roping during the month of August.
8. Contestants may enter the #11 Roping twice by switching partners; however, switching ends does not qualify. Contestants roping together in the PRCA Team Roping may not rope together in the #11 Roping at the same rodeo regardless of performance or slack. Six teams (determined by preference and order of entry) will rope in the performance. No contestant may rope twice in the same performance.
9. Pee Wee Barrel Racing is for contestants 8 and under on June 18, 2010. The Pee Wee Barrel Racing Championship is based on Points. Points are awarded for the four fastest times of each rodeo. First Place receives 4 Points, 3 Points for Second, 2 Points for Third and 1 Point for Fourth. Unrelated to the Season Championship, three ribbons are awarded each performance and may be picked up at the Rodeo Secretary's office the night of the competition. 10. The Steamboat Springs Pro Rodeo Series Board of Directors reserves the right to clarify and if necessary revise these Ground Rules. In the event of a dispute, their decision is final.
